Housing as Health project opens

The Portland Business Journal reported a collaboration between Central City Concern and Portland health systems has opened the third and final piece of their Housing as Health project. Known as the Blackburn Center, the facility includes a health care clinic, pharmacy, 51 units of respite care for people discharged from hospitals, 80 units for alcohol- and drug-free transitional housing, and 34 permanent housing units.

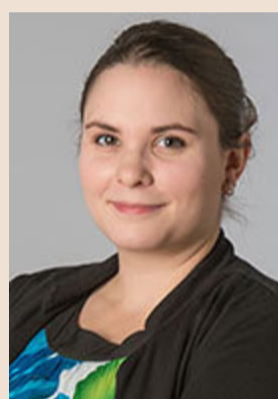
