

Attention, Aggie Advocates — this is a Call to Action.

The Texas Legislature is considering creating a second veterinary school, which is unnecessary and will dilute state support for Texas A&M's College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences and for the university as a whole.



Texas Capitol

The Texas Senate and Lieutenant Governor Dan Patrick need to hear from Aggies on this issue now.

- 1. According to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's 2016 report, Texas A&M is meeting all of the veterinary medical needs of Texas.
- 2. There are over 4,880 Aggie veterinarians currently living in Texas.
- 3. Texas A&M has increased its class size by 25 percent to be the largest college of veterinary medicine in the U.S., and 60 percent of practicing veterinarians in the state are A&M graduates.
- 4. Texas A&M boasts the largest number of food animal, rural, and mixed animal veterinarians in the nation, with 40 percent of the 2018 class choosing those pathways.
- 5. More than \$200 million in facilities funding has gone to help Texas A&M meet the need, and we have responded to every recommendation from the Coordinating Board on this issue.
- 6. The state should not invest in an unnecessary new school that has not been approved by any regulatory or accrediting bodies.
