### PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

After enduring a year of hybrid learning, various COVID restrictions, and other disruptions we now recognize the need to return to some missing basics of what we would consider "normal" school. However, as a school we are struggling with some basic student behaviors around things like attendance and tardies that are hurting our school culture. The basics of being in class and on time is something we cannot continue to have ignored.

For perspective, on a daily basis we have nearly 200 students arrive late to the first period alone. We have tried to let this play out, require students to sign in, and give verbal reminders of when school starts and the importance of being on time.

We need the help of our families to understand that school starts at 8:40 (or 9:55 on Wednesday). Parents need to adjust their time in getting to school if they are dropping students off for class to ensure they are here with enough time to get to class. For students who drive themselves we need them to know that parking will be limited and they should arrive with plenty of time to find a spot in the front or back parking lot.

students abuse off-campus privileges and perpetuate their lateness throughout the day. This is on us as a school staff to reinforce the culture that we want around the importance of being in class and prioritizing learning.

So what are we going to do about it? Starting on Monday, October 15th we are going to be tracking tardies and absences for students to be given punitive measures if they cannot be here and on time. There is already a process in place for students who are absent without reason and placed in a truancy prevention process. What we are focused on is addressing the excessive tardies. Here is the basic structure of our steps and outcomes.

Student tardies are tracked in one week increments. 5 or more tardies for one week will result in the following consequences.

First consequence = Wednesday, Zero Hour detention

Second consequence = additional detention assigned

Third consequence = parent meeting about attendance and tardies with administration

Future consequences = if students fail to change their behaviors, we will look at taking away privileges and consider assigning lunch detention so students may not leave at all, loss of the ability to attend school functions (games and activities), and for Seniors it may include losing the ability to walk at graduation.

EVHS Administration recognizes our role in the development of this problem. We have not been stringent about attendance and tardy issues for the last year and a half. We are willing to step forward and address issues such as this, but need the help and support of our community if we are actually going to make a difference.

Thank you to everyone for your help and support as we prioritize our learning environment.

EVHS is offering the PSAT/NMSQT on **Tuesday**, **Oct. 26**, **2021** to interested sophomores and juniors.

The PSAT/NMSQT is offered to 10th and 11th graders as part of the SAT Suite of Assessments. It is designed to help prepare students for the SAT, college, and careers. Historically, students who took the PSAT/NMSQT scored higher on the SAT, on average, than those who didn't take the test. This is also the National Merit Qualifying Test for juniors who achieve a qualifying score. If your sophomore or junior would like to register for this exam, they must sign up with Audrey Aberle in the main office and pay an \$18 exam fee at the time they sign up.
