IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON MIDDLE FRENCH IMMERSION

There is an important deadline coming up for students looking to participate in TDSB's French language programs.

The deadline to apply to our Middle French Immersion (Grade 4 entry) program is January 29th, 2021. Grade 3 is the only time your child may apply to begin the Middle French Immersion program and there will be no other opportunities to enter this program.

WHAT IS MIDDLE FRENCH IMMERSION?

Middle French Immersion programs are designed for students who do not speak French at home. The Middle French Immersion program (Grade 4 Entry) offers 100% model of French instruction in Grades 4 and 5 in most schools (with the exception of a PREP

providing subject that may be delivered in English if required). English is introduced in Grade 6. The model of instruction for Grades 6 - 8 is 75% French and 25% English with Science and Language taught in English.

Please note: This program will replace the Junior Extended French program as the Grade 4 entry program in TDSB.

The subjects taught in French from Grade 4 through to Grade 8:

- Math
- Social Studies (Geography/History)
- French Language

After Grade 8, students continue the French Immersion program at designated secondary schools. Students who successfully complete a minimum of 10 credits in French at the secondary school level are eligible for a Certificate of Bilingual Studies in French within the TDSB.

INTERNATIONAL LANGUAGES AND AFRICAN HERITAGE

In an increasingly globalized world, it is important to set our students on the path to being active global citizens. The TDSB takes great pride in providing International Languages and African Heritage programs to all students from K to Grade 8. No background knowledge is necessary and we encourage students to explore all languages.

This fall, the International Languages - Elementary/African Heritage Program will be offering language classes to students (TDSB and non TDSB) Kindergarten to Grade 8. Students will take part in a remote/at home learning. One day each week, they will have live face-to-face interactive lessons with their instructor and other students for approximately 30 minutes. Activities will be focused on building student's abilities in oral communication, reading and writing.

Please note that a minimum of 23 students is required to open a language class.

TAMIL HERITAGE MONTH

Tamil Heritage Month is recognized nationally since October 2016, provincially since March 2004 and by the Toronto District School Board since January 2016. The month of January was chosen as it coincides with one of the most important celebrations for Canadians of Tamil heritage, the Thai Pongal harvest festival. Millions of Tamil people around the world irrespective of their religion celebrate Thai Pongal and offer thanks for an abundant harvest.

This year, the chosen theme selected by the volunteer planning committee is **உண்மை - உரிமை - ஒத்துழைப்பு: Truth - Rights – Unity.** **Unmai** (உண்மை) recognizes that our lived experiences are our truths and these truths shape our understanding of the world around us. **Urimai** (உரிமை) examines our right to flourish and shine. **Otrumai** (ஒத்துழைப்பு) emphasizes our shared lived experiences with other marginalized communities and our shared humanity.
