• OHSU Department of Dermatology is looking for motivated pre-healthcare career graduates to fill our <u>open clinic aid positions</u> and join our nursing team. Job duties include (but are not limited to) rooming patients, taking a brief history, scribing for the visit, setting up biopsy trays, assisting with procedures, wound dressings, and patient education in addition to stocking rooms and other clerical duties. This is an excellent way to earn quality patient care experience for whatever journey lies ahead for you! Requirements for the position are completion of Anatomy and Physiology and a GPA 3.0 or above. This opportunity will allow you to work with an excellent group of physicians, physician assistants, and nurse practitioners. The faculty regularly mentor

- The Portland VA Research Foundation (PVARF) is sponsoring summer fellowship opportunities for undergraduate students to gain hands-on experience in laboratories and research activities at the VA Portland Healthcare System. In addition students will have the opportunity to meet with scientists from varying disciplines and levels in the scientific field, work with mentors, and see how research is done. The 2022 Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship provides unique research opportunities across a range of research areas. Projects will be under the direction of a Principal Investigator (Mentor) and other team members. This is a 10-week program with 40 hours per week expected. The targeted start date for this year's program is June 6, 2022. Participants will receive a support stipend of \$5,500.
- Casa de Esperanza seeks applicants for the <u>Hands of Hope Service Year Program</u>, an ideal gap year opportunity for pre-med/pre-health students. Casa de Esperanza provides residential foster care to children ages birth through six who are in crisis due to abuse, neglect or the effects of HIV. For a complete description see here.
