

Frieson Black Cultural Center

The Black Cultural Center (BCC) was first established at the University of Tennessee in 1976 in a two story house. Its status on campus came into question, however, in 1980 after the Director, Dennis Littlejohn, was fired from his position. Students coordinated a weekend long sit-in, but

were met with an eviction notice, leading to the arrest of 18 students who were nonviolent, but

refused to leave. The next day, 200 students marched to Andy Holt Tower where they stayed until the BCC was reopened. Since 2002, the BCC has been located at the corner of Melrose Avenue and Melrose Place. It houses an array of programs from an African American Hall of Fame to free peer tutoring programs. In 2015, the BCC was renamed the Ron and Don Frieson Black Cultural Center to recognize the \$1 million donation and commitment to diversity from the Ron and Don Frieson brothers.
