UAH student group set to launch new instrument payload on NASA rocket to study harnessing reentry heat and converting it to electrical energy

The Terminus Spaceflight Research Group, a subset of the Space Hardware Club at UAH, is set to send a new payload into space. The student group aims to loft a CubeSat-like device that will examine the potential of producing electrical energy by harnessing the heating experienced on reentry of the vehicle, as well as performing biological experiments.

"We believe the data taken from our experiment can be used to inform the design and testing of future planetary reentry vehicles," said Maria Chytka, an aerospace engineering student and Terminus project

lead. "If proven feasible, this application could then be used in future reentry missions, such as missions to Venus, Mars, Titan or increasing the electrical efficiency of any shorter-term Earth missions.


