A NOTE FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT

Dear LSU Families.

I hope your Tiger's fall semester is off to a great start. By now, they should be finding their academic rhythm and building a routine that will help them be successful inside and outside the classroom this year. The beginning of the semester is the perfect time for them to



set intentions and begin accessing campus resources. One of the great things about LSU is that if your student needs help along the way, we have great people on campus eager to provide it. Please let us know.

I would be remiss in not acknowledging that you have likely read some of the recent reports of crime on or near campus. We understand your heightened concern as parents and want you to know that your Tiger's health, safety, and well-being are always our utmost priority. If you have not seen the updates on recent crime reports, please click here to learn more.

Unfortunately, since LSU is a small city bordered by a large metropolitan area, crime can happen despite our best efforts. While we would prefer not to have incidents on our campus, we are fortunate to have a responsive police force equipped to respond quickly, investigate thoroughly, and make arrests when necessary. LSU has 60 sworn law enforcement officers who

September 13: <u>Career</u> <u>Expo</u>, 11 a.m.-4 p.m. patrol campus 24/7, 365 days per year. At night, they provide additional focus on residence halls. They also work closely with federal, state, and local public safety partners when necessary.

In addition to the above measures, LSU is working to enhance our extensive security camera system and upgrade lighting across campus. We also provide multiple safety resources for students:

- Nighttime shuttle service: LSU's <u>Campus Transit</u> is an on-demand service that runs from 5 p.m. to midnight, seven days a week. Students can schedule a ride via the <u>TransLoc Rider app</u>.
- Safe transport by LSU PD: Any LSU student who needs a ride on campus after Campus Transit closes at midnight can call LSU Police to provide safe transportation. They should dial 225-578-3231 or use the LSU Shield app and click "Request a Safe Transport by LSU PD."
- Emergency text messages: Your student can register
 their mobile phone to receive emergency text messages
 from LSU by accessing their MyLSU account and clicking
 on "Campus Community" and "Emergency Text
 Message" to subscribe.
- Rideshare safety: If using a ride-share service, students should remember that they are getting into a vehicle with a stranger. They should use caution and follow <u>these</u> <u>tips</u>.
- Self-defense classes: LSU Police and the Student
 Health Center offer <u>Rape Aggression Defense</u> (RAD)
 Classes for women. RAD is a 12-hour
 personal safety course. LSU Police also offers
 the <u>Equalizer Self Defense Program</u> throughout the
 year or upon request for groups.

While the above resources are great ways for your student to stay safe, they can prevent many incidents by using caution and good judgment. Students should keep their car doors locked and never leave the vehicle's key fob inside the car. It is also essential not to leave valuables in plain sight inside the vehicle, even if it is locked. Also, it is imperative that they lock their residence hall or apartment doors and ensure that exterior doors close securely behind them when they enter the building from outside.

With any incident on campus, we ask individuals to call 911 or 225-578-3231 immediately. Waiting will delay assistance, delay the investigation and apprehension of any suspects, and delay our **emergency notifications or timely warnings** to the campus.
