

Let's talk about race

At Safe Harbor, we recognize that domestic violence, racism, and sexism intersect in the lives of Black women, resulting in high barriers to support and safety. Consequently, Black women are far more likely to die due to domestic violence. Last Tuesday, we held a Community Talk-Back about Black Women's Experience with Intimate Partner Violence. We hope to continue the conversation about the barriers faced by African American women and how we can address them as a community. Why it matters

- Although domestic violence affects people of all backgrounds and identities, African American women are disproportionately impacted.
- Over 50% of female homicide victims in the U.S. are African American, and homicide at the hands of an intimate partner is the leading cause of premature death among African American women ages 15-44.
- African American women are murdered by men at more than twice the rate of white women.
- South Carolina consistently ranks among the top 10 states in the nation for women killed by men annually, with African American women experiencing a disproportionately high rate of lethal violence.
