It's Taekwondo Time!

Students in the DreamStarters Program began an 8-week Taekwondo class under the instruction of Grand Master Chief Anderson, Director of Anderson Taekwondo Center (ATC). Anderson Taekwondo Center has partnered with Brandon House to teach our students discipline, respect, self-control, leadership, goal-setting and teamwork.

Taekwondo, a Korean form of martial arts, is a discipline that shows students ways of enhancing their spirit and life through training their bodies and mind. Characterized by punching and kicking techniques, with emphasis on head-height kicks, spinning jump kicks, and fast kicking techniques, one of the principles of Taekwondo is to attain permanent or lasting peace through the spirit of unity.

The DreamStarters students will be able to progress to the next belt by going through promotion tests, where the student demonstrates their skills in numerous aspects of Taekwondo in front of the Grand Master Chief and a panel of judges. Stay tuned for the date for the student's Taekwondo promotion tests.

Spearheaded by Damen Tolbert, Valricka Mitchell, and Charles Green, our BH staff is dedicated to recruiting and serving youth who attend Parkview High School and/or mandated by the courts to complete community service hours, remain in good standing while on probation and/or parole, or looking for assistance to cultivate employability skills to prepare for the workforce. One of the components in iH.U.S.T.L.E. is offering ACT Workkeys sessions so that participants are able to earn the Career Readiness Certificate recognized by several employers across the state.
