Dana Schutz: Eating Atom Bombs debuts a new series of paintings by Schutz ('00) at Transformer Station in Cleveland. Created mostly in the past year, the works reflect the turbulent political atmosphere experienced in the United States in the wake of the 2016 election. Though our society may seem more divided than ever, the exhibition suggests that this uncertainty may be what unites us. An opening reception will be held 6-9pm Friday, January 19.

Natural Order and Chaos: Deborah Pinter ('88) is on view at BAYarts in Bay Village through February 3. The exhibition features monoprints created with real natural elements, including

sticks, flowers, and leaves arranged in unconventional, yet organized ways, to document the unpredictable and often contradictory patterns in nature. A gallery talk will take place at 1pm Sunday, February 4.
