We expect these air filters be useful in the years to come.

In addition, our Senior Team is now in the process of planning for the coming 2021-2022 school year. We will connect with you for feedback as the plans mature.

Testing options include take-home tests, mobile testing sites and on-site testing in schools. For the on-site testing in schools, there are two models:


- a hub model where one school hosts schools within the same neighbourhood


