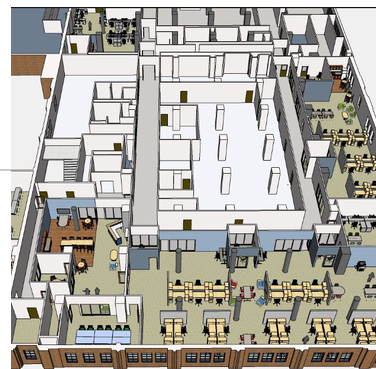

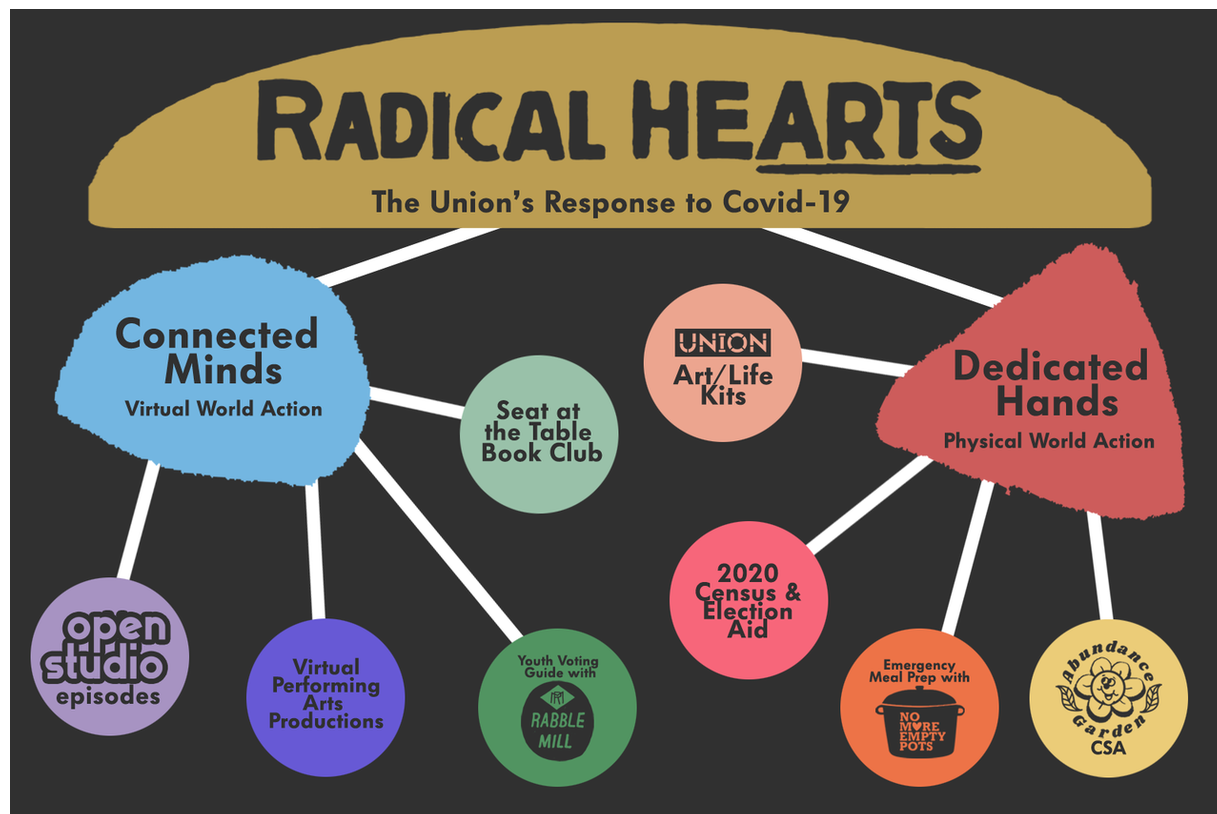


Pinnacle Bank Accepting Submissions for 2021 Calendar

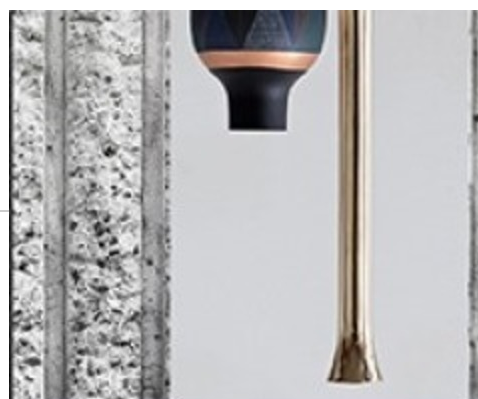
