

TOPS remains a great concern for all Louisiana students. The proposed TOPS budget is funded at only 25% of the previous year's level, which would tremendously reduce access for Louisiana students. However, the Regular Legislative Session doesn't end until June 6, so much can change between now and then. Fill out the Federal Application for Student Financial Aid (FASFA) now if you haven't already. If there is indeed a shortfall, those with completed FASFAs will be given TOPS priority over those who did not submit the paperwork.





LSU Academic Programs Abroad



With summer for our students finally here, we are excited to send over 200 LSU students abroad on <u>summer programs</u> this year! Students will earn up to seven credit hours while they study for up to six weeks in a foreign country. A summer program is an ideal choice for those students who want an international experience but are a little more reluctant to venture away from home on their own. On a summer program, they travel with other LSU students, and take courses taught by LSU professors on site.

Students on Summer Programs tend to do better than those on LSU's campus. The classes that are taken abroad are not easier than the classes taken in Baton Rouge, but our summer program participants are in an ideal learning environment. They get to discuss their lessons in the classroom, then physically see and experience what they just learned in the real world. We find that the learning material seems to stick a little better when you can read about the remnants of Roman architecture in Paris, and then go touch it that same afternoon. In addition to that, class sizes are really small and students have access to faculty members almost 24/7. Summer programs provide LSU students with a truly unique experience that enhances their resume as well as their capacity to learn.

Incoming Freshmen Checklist

- Immunizations: Make sure to submit your immunization records to complete registration. To download the compliance form, visit http://www.shc.lsu.edu/immunizations.html.
- MyStudentBody: MyStudentBody (MSB) Essentials is an online comprehensive course featuring alcohol, drugs, and sexual violence information. This course is mandatory for all incoming LSU students, and must be passed with a score of 80% or higher. For more information, visit www.lsu.edu/mystudentbody.
- The Pharmacy at LSU: The Student Health Center Pharmacy is closed. For assistance with obtaining refills over the summer months or temporarily transferring prescriptions to a pharmacy of your choice, call 225-578-5651. In August 2016, a new pharmacy, The Pharmacy at LSU, will open. There are some exciting improvements, made with students in mind, which you can expect with this change, including an updated space, expanded services and seamless insurance billing. Movements to Senior Colleges

UCFY students who have successfully completed their senior college admission requirements will be moved from UCFY to the appropriate senior college during three separate moves over the summer months. The first move involves those students who met the senior college requirements and are enrolled in summer school. The second move occurs for students who did not enroll in summer school and have met their requirements at the end of the spring semester. The third move occurs for summer term students who at the end of the summer term will have met the senior college requirements. In most instances, these moves are in an automated process with no action needed by the students. However, there are a few instances in which the student must make a formal application to a senior college (Mass Communication majors, Art and Design Majors, and General Business majors – these students will be notified as to the procedures for admission to these colleges).

Sumer Requests for Grade Exclusion Policy

In order to take advantage of the Grade Exclusion Policy for courses students are repeating during the summer term, there is a strict deadline to be granted this privilege. That deadline is June 9, 2016 by 4:30 p.m. Approvals for grade exclusion must be executed with an academic counselor. UCFY students should see a counselor in 150 Allen Hall. If enrolled in

UCAC, the student should see a counselor in 150 Himes Hall. If students have been admitted to a senior college, then a counselor in the appropriate senior college office must execute the grade exclusion.

Fall Scheduling

Fall 2016 class scheduling began in April for freshmen students via their PAWS accounts. Students can view their date and time for class scheduling by logging into PAWS and clicking Registration Services > Schedule Request. Advising and course selection assistance is available for UCFY students in 150 Allen Hall.

Receive emergency text messages from LSU:

Register your cell number to receive emergency text messages in case of an immediate safety issue on campus by visiting http://my.lsu.edu/ and clicking on "Personal Preferences" and "Emergency Contacts." While there, fill out your emergency contact

information, too. There is no fee to subscribe to the emergency text message service, but regular text messaging rates through your provider will apply.

Free App for Emergencies on Campus:

A free smart phone app, called LSU SHIELD, is now available to the LSU community. Available for both iOS and Android operating systems, LSU SHIELD is designed to help students, faculty and staff report emergencies or crimes, receive help from police, or simply check on each other to ensure they've arrived safely at their destinations or returned safely from class, their workouts, or other outings. Please consider downloading the free app to your phone. The app will prompt you for various information, not all of which is required. However, the more information you enter, the better the app will work for you.
