Consular Office Hours

The Consulate-General of Japan in Chicago currently offers the following operating times for Consular Services:

- Consular Service windows will be open from Monday - Friday 10:00am to 12:15pm and 1:15 to 3:00pm.
- The Consular Section's phones will be available to call between 9:15 am and 12:15pm, and again from 1:15 to 5:00pm.

We do ask that all visitors cooperate with following necessary precautions:

- If you are feeling ill, please wait to come in until you are feeling completely well again.
 - Please only come in to the Consulate for essential activities. If it can wait, please consider doing so.
 - In accordance with CDC guidelines, a maximum of 10 people will be allowed in the waiting room. Be aware that you may need to wait outside the waiting room should more than 10 people be present.

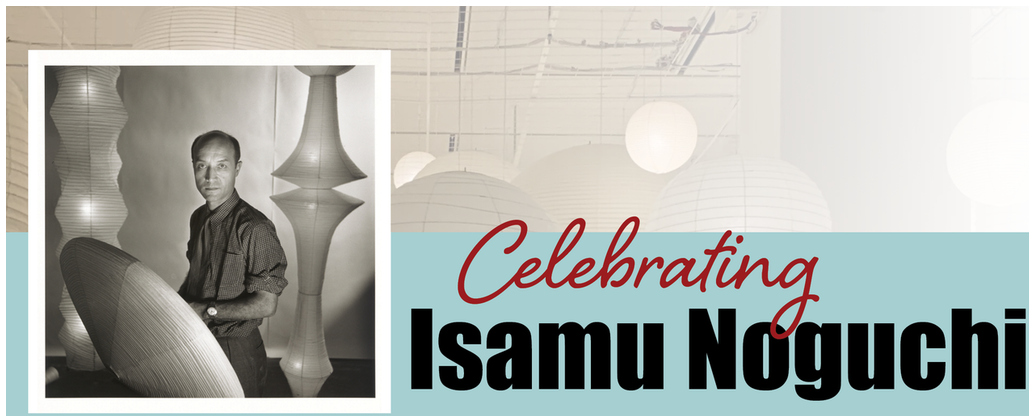
Holiday Delight with the Japanese-American Service Committee

Noguchi November - Celebrating Isamu **Noguchi's Birthday with the La Porte** **County Public Library**

Born in Los Angeles, Noguchi moved to Japan at the age of two and returned to the United States in 1918 where he attended high school in Rolling Prairie and La Porte, Indiana. During this time, local families nurtured a young Noguchi, encouraging his artistic talents. The world-renowned sculptor considered himself a lifelong Hoosier while creating unique sculptures, gardens, furniture, lighting designs, and more during his career. 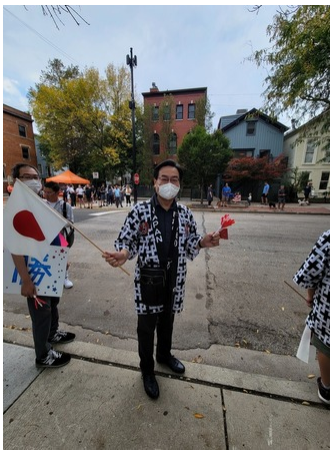

Consul-General visits Evanston Township High School

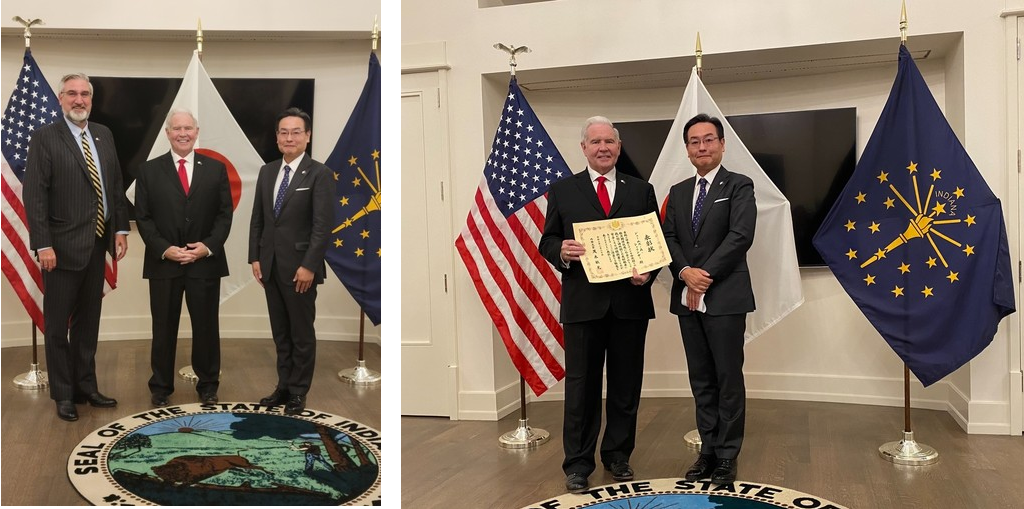

THIS MONTH IN JAPAN

Shimotsuki, the ancient name for November, means "frost month." There are two national holidays in Japan this month: Bunka no Hi (Culture Day – Nov. 3rd) celebrates culture, arts, and academics. Kinrō Kansha no Hi (Labor Thanksgiving Day – Nov. 23rd) is a day to give thanks to hard work and prosperity.

Although not a national holiday, another holiday that's observed during this month is Shichi-Go-San (Seven-Five-Three – Nov. 15th), where 7-year-old girls, 5-year-old-boys, and 3-year-old girls dress in traditional clothing, visit shrines, and pray with their families.
