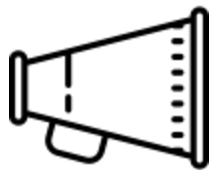

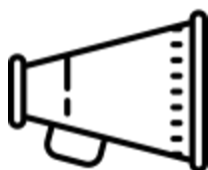

Consular Office Hours

The Consulate-General of Japan in Chicago currently offers the following operating times for Consular Services:

- Consular Service windows will be open from Monday - Friday

10:00am to 12:15pm and 1:15 to 3:00pm.

- The Consular Section's phones will be available to call between 9:15 am and 12:15pm, and again from 1:15 to 5:00pm.

We do ask that all visitors cooperate with following necessary precautions:

- If you are feeling ill, please wait to come in until you are feeling completely well again.
- Please only come in to the Consulate for essential activities. If it can wait, please consider doing so.
- In accordance with CDC guidelines, a maximum of 10 people will be allowed in the waiting room. Be aware that you may need to wait outside the waiting room should more than 10 people be present.

The Japan Information Center on the 10th floor's current operating hours are as follows:

Monday – Friday (except Consulate holidays) 9:30am to 12:00pm and 1:30pm to 5:00pm (library procedures will end 15 minutes before closing time)

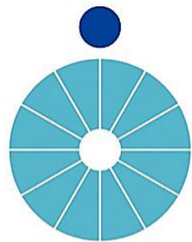

THIS MONTH IN JAPAN

皐月

satsuki

皐月 (Satsuki). May. Named after the rice planting season, 早苗 (Sanae). Therefore, it's sometimes called 早月 (Satsuki). This might remind you of the famous Ghibli film "My Neighbor Totoro" where the main characters' names are "Satsuki" and "Mei", both which come from this month.



Satsuki, is the traditional name for May. It is named after the rice planting season, *sanae*.

Three years ago, His Majesty the Emperor Naruhito ascended to the throne on May 1st, ushering in a new Era. The Era is known as 令和 (Reiwa), meaning "Beautiful Harmony." The name was taken from wording in the Manyoshu, Japan's oldest poetry anthology, completed more than 1,200 years ago.

Every year during the end of April and beginning of May, many people have lots of time off because of consecutive national holidays: Showa Day (4/29), Constitution Memorial Day (5/3), Greenery Day (5/4) and Children's Day (5/5). This time is known as Golden Week and is considered one of the busiest times for travel in Japan.
